The medical tent is for hurt people who cut their arm or leg, and the sleeping tent is for sleeping in and or for me treating sick people.

### **Stormont letter from the front 03:**

26<sup>th</sup> of July 1916

Dear mum,

Hi mum, today a bomb went off. Before it went off I was in the medical room recovering from being gassed by the horrid Germans.

All of a sudden 'bang', a really huge bomb went off. When I went outside I saw trees that had fallen down. The horses from the stables had ran away, but don't worry, I'm ok. I just have a shiver down my spine, but I'm ok.

#### **Stormont letter from the front 04:**

Dee,

I miss you so much, Fluffy too. And tell her I love her so much, and tell mum too.

I know you want to know about the war. It's ok, I didn't get hurt at all. There was a big bomb, it was very scary. I didn't hurt myself, so don't get sad because I will get sad.

And I want you to know that I love you all the time. And give Fluffy a big kiss from me. I hope you have a good time at school.

I had a most frightening day. The bomb blew my legs off.

I am in a wheelchair in the hospital. When it happened I was in a tank.

I don't feel pain in my legs and I am getting better. The horse helped me and took me to the medical tent.
